13th Annual “Come Go With Me” Poster Contest
• Program Rules •

1. **JUDGING CRITERION:** Winning entries are those deemed to be the most graphically and conceptually pleasing representations of how Long Islanders can use alternative means of transportation to reduce single-occupancy auto travel and improve air quality. The judges include personnel from LITM, and/or NYS DOT and their representatives, and educational and community representatives of Long Island. All decisions are final. Winners will be selected on or about March 12, 2008. Winners need not be present to win and the teacher will be contacted by phone shortly after March 14, 2008.
2. **CATEGORIES:** Participating student entries are divided into two categories by grade:
 - a) Kindergarten-Third Grade
 - b) Fourth-Eighth Grade
3. **REQUIREMENTS:**
 - a) *Size:* Please use only 8 _ x 11 standard size paper. You may use your own or you can download and print the official LITM Poster contest paper form on the LITM website at www.4commute.com, or contact Janice Campbell at LITM for a complimentary supply. Watercolor paints and colored pencils are prohibited. Please make sure students use only markers, crayons and non-watercolor paints. Since the winning entries will be printed in a high quality calendar, use of color is important, neatness counts, and **pencil lines are discouraged.**
 - b) *Identification of Entry:* It is *mandatory* that a complete **Entry Form Label** (enclosed) be taped or glued (no staples) on the back of each poster entry. To avoid bleed-through, please do not write any personal information on the front and/or back of the artwork. All information requested is for identification purposes and for contacting the winners only. The information we request is the student's name, address, phone, age, grade, school, and art teacher's name and phone.
 - c) *Limitations on Entries:* Only one child's name per poster and one entry per child are permitted. Posters created by more than one student are ineligible.
 - d) *Safety Considerations:* Posters must reflect current safety standards, such as helmets on bicycle riders and rollerbladers and **seat belts on car passengers.**
 - e) *Grammar, Punctuation, and Spelling:* Proper grammar, spelling, and punctuation are required for this educational program. As part of our high quality calendar, the artwork is widely distributed.
4. **PRIZES:** Minimally, the prize packages include the following for each category —

6. **DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES:** Entries must be received no later than **3 pm on Friday, March 7, 2008**, at LITM, 510 Broad Hollow Road, Suite 206, Melville, NY 11747. LITM is not responsible for lost or misdirected mail. To ensure your entries are received, consider sending your entries via the U.S. Postal Service's Delivery Confirmation Receipt method.

7. **TRANSFER OF RIGHTS:** All entries are non-returnable and remain the property of LITM and NYS DOT. All artwork received may be displayed and/or reprinted at any time in any venue without further consent. Winning artwork will not be reproduced in the Calendar without written consent of the parent/guardian. LITM will retain the right to use winners name/ likeness, artwork and/or recorded voice for advertising or promotional purposes without additional compensation.

8. Submission of an entry constitutes acceptance of all contest rules. All interpretations of the rules and decisions regarding the drawing by LITM and NYS DOT are final.

9. LITM reserves the right to change or cancel this contest at any time.

• *Project Suggestions* •

CONTEXT:

You are encouraged to think about ways to reduce traffic congestion and improve air quality on Long Island. As you use various art materials to create posters, you will learn the importance of commute options, such as carpooling, telecommuting, mass transit traveling, biking and walking, to reduce single-occupant auto travel. One way to start the thought process is to list ways to get to work without driving alone. Another way is to talk with your family, friends, or teacher and discuss the negative impacts of traffic congestion (air pollution, increased stress, longer commutes, etc.) and the positive impacts of reducing traffic congestion (healthier lungs, calmer people, more time to relax with the family, etc.). These conversations provide a segue into the topic of driving etiquette and safety, such as being courteous to fellow drivers, adhering to traffic laws, and obeying traffic signals.

STUDENTS:

Use a variety of sources for conveying and developing ideas, images and themes in the creation of your artwork. Translate transportation, rideshare and environmental concepts into a poster combining appealing artwork with a snappy caption.

For example, discuss how Long Islanders can help reduce single-occupancy car travel, such as “buddying up” in a carpool and using the train, buses and HOV Lanes.

Here are some other ideas you can use to illustrate different themes:

- Commuters using buses and trains
- A commuter picking up a carpool or vanpool partner(s).
- Commuters utilizing the HOV Lanes
- Biking and walking to “run” errands
- Trip Chaining: Grouping errands together in a loop to save time and gas and to pollute less by reducing travel miles
- Telecommuting
- Hybrid Vehicles
- Using your car less just one day each week will give everyone cleaner air.

Entries from prior years included colorful visuals combined with creative headlines, like:

- Why Drive Alone? Come Go With Me!
- Spare the Air, Do Your Share, Carpool There and Everywhere
- Don't be a polluter commuter: Be part of a group effort!
- To Keep Clean Air, Bike and Hike in Between
